The Hon Sandra Nori joins Komosion board

Sydney, April 14, 2009: The Honourable Sandra Nori, a former long-serving Minister in the NSW Government, has joined the Board of digital marketing and website publishing software company Komosion.

Ms Nori was a member of the NSW Parliament for 19 years and served as a Minister of the Crown and Parliamentary Secretary for 12 years. She retired from Parliament in 2007 and has since been appointed a director of the boards of Macquarie University and TAFE NSW.

Nori served NSW as its **Minister for Small Business (and Trade); Minister for Tourism; Minister for Women; Minister for Sport and Recreation; Minister for Major Venues and Events;** and **Minister Assisting the Minister for State and Regional Development.**

Prior to becoming a Minister, Ms Nori also served as Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Health and Deputy Premier and as Parliamentary Secretary to the Treasurer, Minister for Energy and Minister for State and Regional Development.

Komosion's chief executive, Mr Berry Driessen, said: "Ms Nori's understanding of government, investment attraction and her wide industry contacts will be of great value as we continue to help public and private sector organisations use the internet to communicate, transact and deliver services as cost effectively as possible."
